3 John

1The elder unto the wellbeloved Gaius, whom I love in the truth.

<u>2</u>Beloved, I wish above all things that thou mayest prosper and be in health, even as thy soul prospereth. <u>3</u>For I rejoiced greatly, when the brethren came and testified of the truth that is in thee, even as thou walkest in the truth. (<u>A Christian should be faithful in walking in the truth</u> (following Jesus – living a lifestyle similar to the one explained in chapter 39 of the pdf file book featured at this website – <u>www.areyousureyouaresaved.com</u>) throughout their life.) <u>4</u>I have no greater joy than to hear that my children walk in truth.

<u>Secure</u> Seleved, thou doest faithfully whatsoever thou doest to the brethren, and to strangers; <u>(One way a Christian can continue to walk in the truth is to provide hospitality and financial support to traveling <u>evangelists.</u>) <u>6</u>Which have borne witness of thy charity before the church: whom if thou bring forward on their journey after a godly sort, thou shalt do well: <u>7</u>Because that for his name's sake they went forth, taking nothing of the Gentiles. <u>8</u>We therefore ought to receive such, that we might be fellowhelpers to the truth. <u>(When a Christian donates to Christian ministries, they become partners in the good works carried out.)</u></u>

<u>9</u>I wrote unto the church: but Diotrephes, who loveth to have the preeminence among them, receiveth us not. <u>10</u>Wherefore, if I come, I will remember his deeds which he doeth, prating against us with malicious words: and not content therewith, neither doth he himself receive the brethren, and forbiddeth them that would, and casteth *them* out of the church.

11Beloved, follow not that which is evil, but that which is good. He that doeth good is of God: but he that doeth evil hath not seen God. (Instead of following Diotrephes' behavior, John wanted Gaius to continue his good work. A Christian who continues to do good (live a lifestyle similar to the one explained in chapter 39 of the pdf file book featured at this website — www.areyousureyouaresaved.com) proves they are of God. A professing Christian who once did good but permanently stopped doing so, proved they haven't seen God (weren't really a Christian). (Matthew 13:20-22)) 12Demetrius hath good report of all men, and of the truth itself: yea, and we also bear record; and ye know that our record is true.

13I had many things to write, but I will not with ink and pen write unto thee:

<u>14</u>But I trust I shall shortly see thee, and we shall speak face to face. Peace *be* to thee. *Our* friends salute thee. Greet the friends by name.
